


What We Do

SINGAPORE - The Covid-19 pandemic has had an impact on many lives and livelihoods, and President's Challenge 2022 will be themed "Supporting Lower-Income Families" to focus on the most affected group.

President Halimah Yacob announced this on Thursday (July 22) during her visit to Fei Yue Family Service Centre in Choa Chu Kang, where she noted that lower-

With the ongoing pandemic, President's Challenge recognises that families in need, such as lower-income families, have been disproportionately affected by the impact of the pandemic due to their vulnerability to economic conditions.

Therefore, President's Challenge 2022 (PC2022) will focus on "Supporting Lower-Income Families" and seek to empower lower-income families with skills and opportunities.

PC2022 will also support efforts to help these families emerge stronger from the pandemic and have a fair chance at achieving their goals, such as through **increasing employment prospects** for them and **providing education opportunities** for their children.
