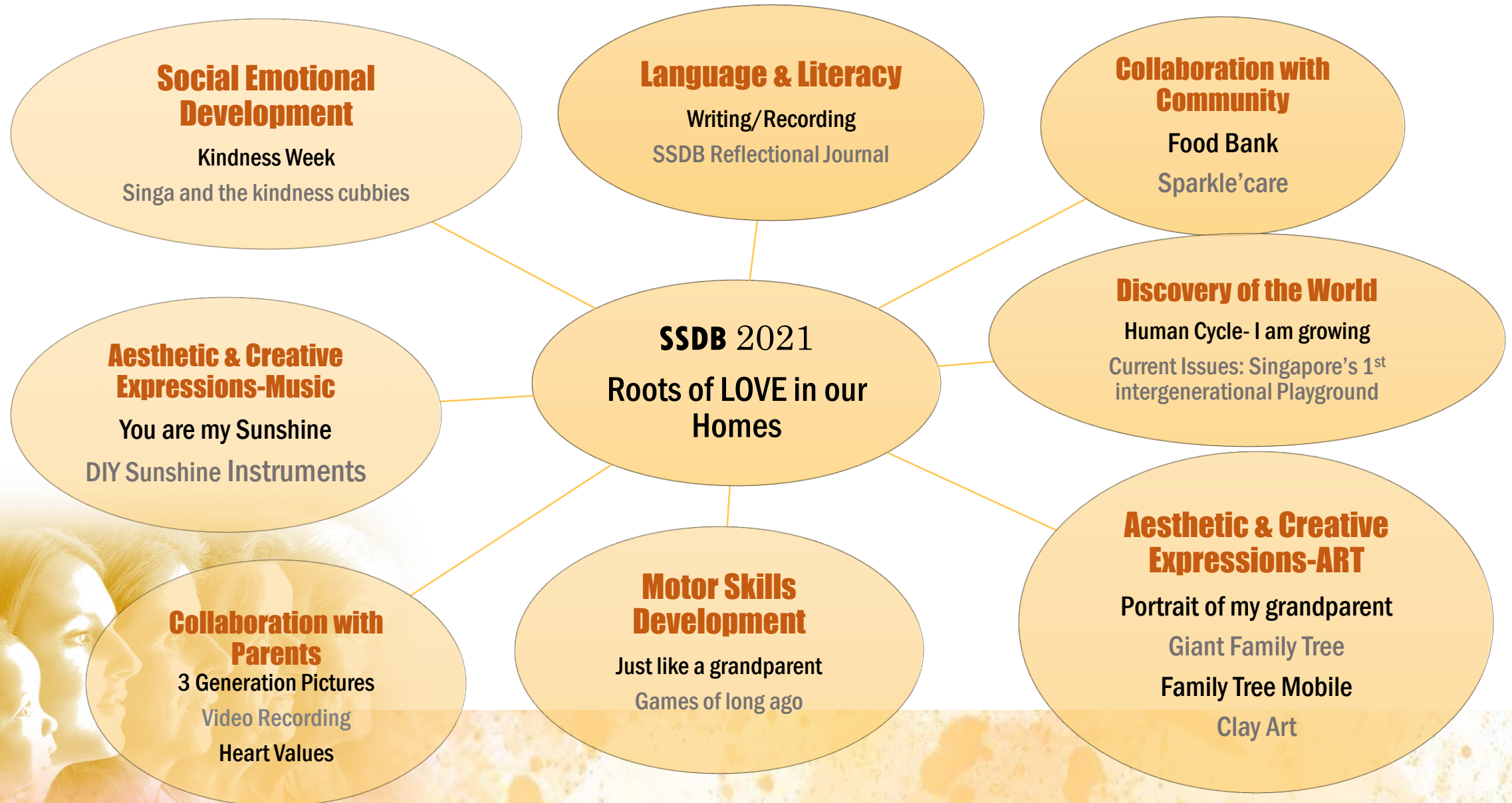
# **Learning Objectives of our project: Roots of Love in our homes (June-August 2021)**

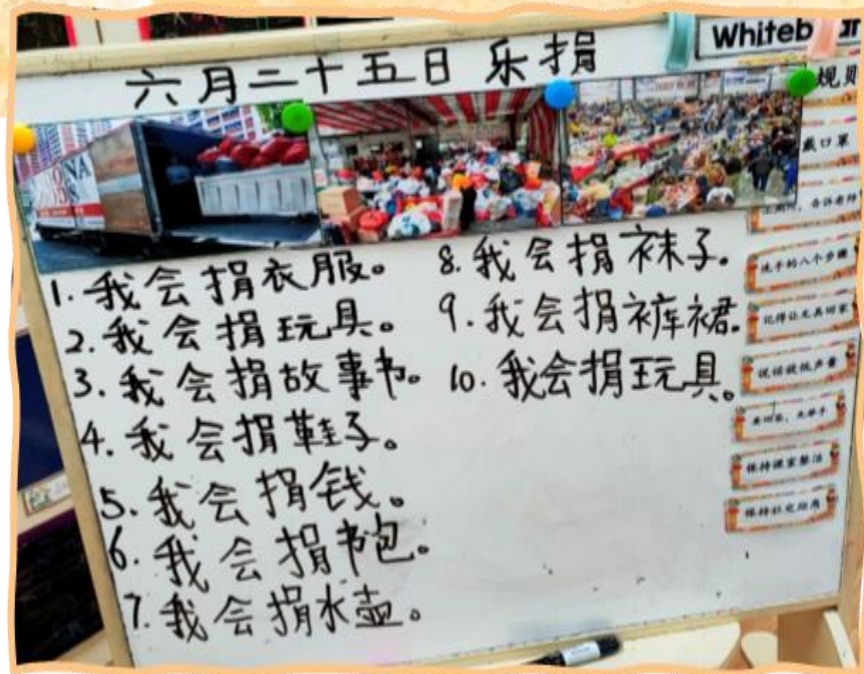

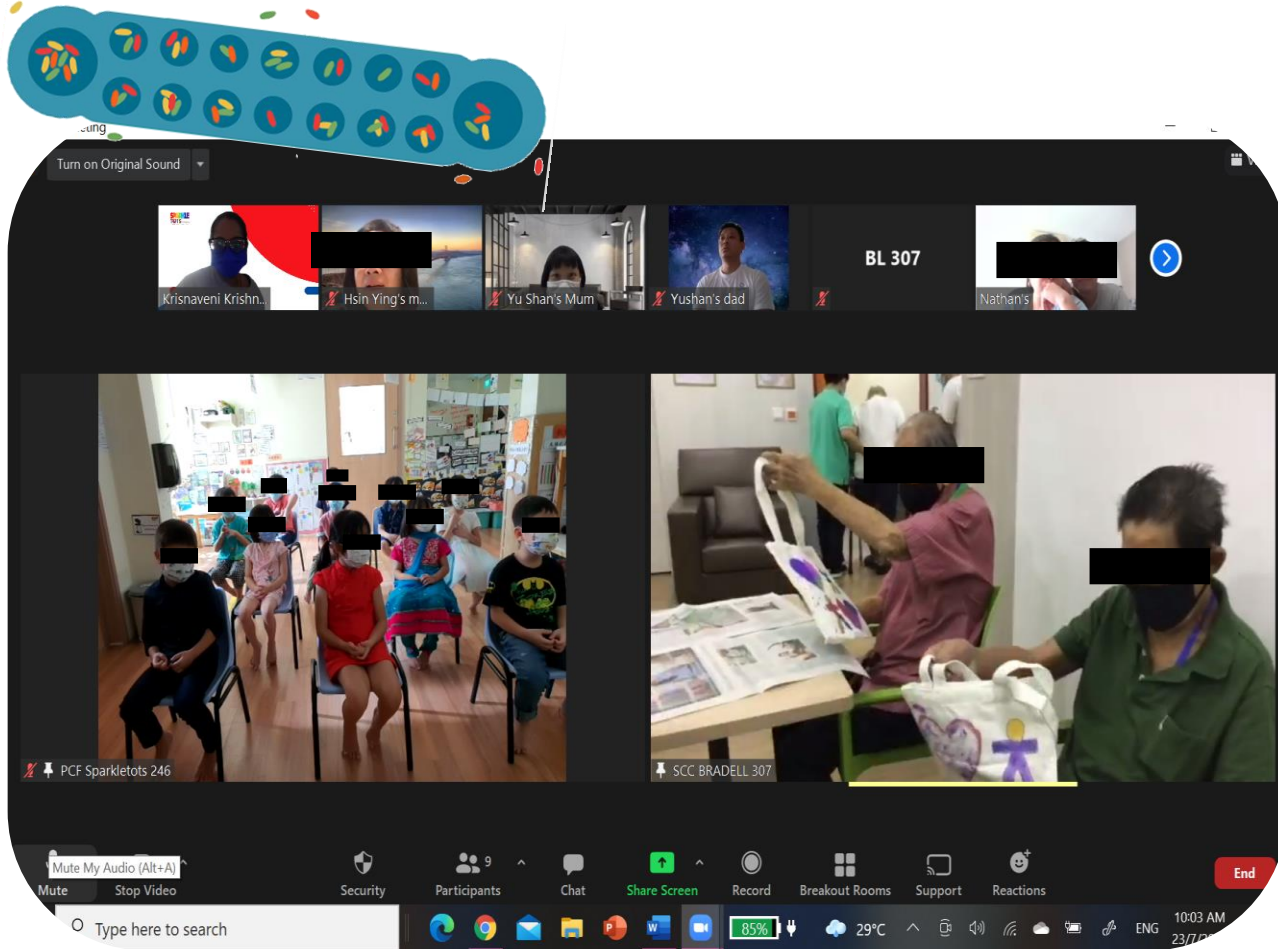






# Racial Harmony with Seniors via Zoom Connect
