For the first time in 2020, the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) and Community Chest collaborated to support pre-schools in embarking on their "Start Small Dream Big" (SSDB) journey under the category: Caring for the Elderly.

The centre collaborated with St Luke's ElderCare Rivervale Centre, with support from Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) and Community Chest. The centre also donated threading activities that featured past and present comparison photos to encourage conversations among the seniors and children. Both the facilities were very supportive, ensuring that the virtual sessions were successful!
