Programme Outline

	DURATION	PROGRAMME DETAILS
		Meeting up! Participants will gather at Siloso Point. Washrooms are available and participants are advised to bring along their own water bottles.
	5 minutes	Hello from Green Nudge! Say hello to our friendly facilitators who will lead participants through an introduction of where and why we are doing a cleanup at Sentosa!
	10 minutes	Gear up for the cleanup! After getting to know our friendly facilitators, participants will receive relevant items such as tongs, bags as well as gloves to carry out the activity in a safe manner. Disposable items are not used to minimise environmental impact.
	30 - 45 minutes	Green Up Sentosa! Participants will break into smaller groups for cleanup activity. Along the way, they are encouraged to collect and log basic information such as weight as well as items observed.
	5 - 15 minutes	Reflection and Tidy Up! Green Nudge to facilitate simple reflection of marine trash collected as well as invite participants to reflect on source of items as well as ways to reduce trash along the area. Participants to return equipment.
W.	10 – 15 minutes	End of Programme! After taking a group photo, participants will each receive a post card or sticker set, showcasing items that can be recycled.

Who should attend these cleanups?

Students from preschool levels to secondary levels are welcome to take part!

What will students learn at the end of the session?

Participants will gain a better awareness of the marine debris around Sentosa, learn more about types of waste as well as how they can take steps towards tackling the marine debris issues in their own ways. In addition, participants will also gain a better appreciation of the people involved in the cleanup process including cleaners and realise their efforts in maintaining the cleanliness of the area.

When are these sessions carried out?

Cleanup activities are best carried out during periods of low tides, and may be carried out during morning or afternoon periods. Check in with us for more information!

How many people can each cleanup accommodate?

To maximise the learning experience, each cleanup can take up to 40 participants.
