

Awarding Excellence



Singapore's national literary prize, the biennial Singapore Literature Prize has been awarded to over 80 writers since 1992. SLP is given to the best works of fiction, poetry, and creative nonfiction across Chinese, English, Malay, and Tamil.



Since 1979, the S.E.A. Write Award, or the Southeast Asian Writers Award, has been presented annually to the best poets and writers in ASEAN. About 40 Singapore writers have been conferred this prestigious award.



Named after literary and library pioneer Hedwig Anuar, the Hedwig Anuar Children's Book Award (HABA) is presented biennially to an outstanding children's book by a Singaporean writer/illustrator.





A joint initiative between SBC and Scholastic Asia, the Scholastic Asian Book Award and Scholastic Picture Book Award are presented on alternate years to an outstanding unpublished children's book or picture book by Asians.



- 15th edition in 2024 (23-26 May) with the theme, 'Curiosity'.






- SBC's school outreach programme to introduce Singapore literature (Sing Lit) and literary arts to children

- Storytelling programmes eligible for Tote Board Arts Grant Subisdy for selected AOP centres







Storytelling Programmes for Preschoolers

AFCC Circle Reading Sessions (2022): online readings featuring children's books from Singapore and Thailand



Ready for KidLit: online sessions by children's book writers and illustrators on dramatised storytelling, wacky poems and illustration activities
